

Passing command-line argument into a DOS (including Windows) batch file

You can use these variables in a batch file:

%0 - the batch file's name

%1 - the 1st argument

%2 - the 2nd argument

%3 - the 3rd argument

...

%9 - the 9th argument

e.g. Support the content of test.bat is as follows:

```
@echo of fecho param0: %0echo param1: %1echo param2: %2echo param3: %3echo param4: %4
```

Then "test a b" gives:

```
param0: testparam1: aparam2: bparam3: param4:
```

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
