

What is ucla.in?

<http://ucla.in> is a service, similar to tinyurl.com, that allows users to shorten a long link, share it, and then track the resulting usage, while keeping the ucla name as part of the link. While other link-shortening services exist such as <http://bit.ly>, only <http://ucla.in> keeps the ucla name as part of the link.

For example, you can use ucla.in to turn this long link:

```
http: //map. ais. ucla. edu/portal/site/UCLA/menuitem. b67ecc2ab4bd59c1ae13e110f848344a/?vgnextoid=38
```

Into this:

<http://ucla.in/92d9Sz>

This makes it easier to include the link in an email or Twitter post without it breaking or taking up too much space.
